What it is

Thymosin Alpha-1 (TA1) is a peptide, a short chain of amino acids that naturally occurs in the body. Peptides help the body do what it is designed to do.

- Thymosin Alpha-1 is a major component of Thymosin Fraction 5 found in the thymus
